

Hunter Valley Golf Course Guide

- FRONT NINE -

HOLE 1



PAR: 4

RANGE: 296m, 295m, 280m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

At Hole 1 you'll find a lake running across the front of the tee, bunkers at the front of the hole and water at the back. Despite this, Hole 1 is actually simple and relatively short. A clean strike across the open fairway will result in just a short iron to the green. The key is accuracy and distance control.

HOLE 2



PAR: 4

RANGE: 294m, 276m, 257m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Hole 2 offers the opportunity for a great score, if a good tee shot is achieved. A short approach is best, as it does have a tight dogleg to the left; from there it's an unprotected open green.

HOLE 3



PAR: 3

RANGE: 111m, 104m, 94m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

A birdie is possible for Hole 3, pending a solid tee shot. There's still some challenges with bunkers at the right side of this short hole. With minimal undulation it's ideal for making putts.

HOLE 4



PAR: 3

RANGE: 167m, 147m, 142m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

With water carry from tee to green, this hole will test your skills. A good score will require an accurate mid to long iron. More cautious players could bail out to the right, leaving a chip and a putt to ensure a par score.

HOLE 5



PAR: 4

RANGE: 400m, 366m, 300m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

This par 4 hole leaves little room for error, with an out of bounds area on the left and dense trees to the right. With a good drive that avoids bunkers there is a solid chance of a birdie.

HOLE 6



PAR: 4

RANGE: 346m, 322m, 299m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Hole 6 is challenging, requiring you to navigate the fairway bunker and surrounding water. The undulating green adds another challenge to putting, so assess the situation before making your move.

HOLE 7



PAR: 4

RANGE: 392m, 380m, 359m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Water sits to the left of the hole and in front of the green, posing a good challenge. For the greatest chance of success, aim for a long and accurate tee shot to the right of the fairway.

HOLE 8



PAR: 3

RANGE: 207m, 197m, 183m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Hole 8 is long for a par 3 and has bunkers in front of the hole to the left and right. You will need an extra club for this hole, so make sure to assess pin position and choose your club wisely. The long, flat green is perfect for putts.

HOLE 9



PAR: 5

RANGE: 515m, 489m, 457m

HOLE DESCRIPTION:

With water running across the fairway, a fairway wood or iron off the tee could be your best bet. This hole features a large undulating double green. Stay at the top tier for the greatest chance at birdie.



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- BACK NINE -

PAR: 3



RANGE: 176m, 150m, 139m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

This hole has an expansive green which slopes down into the water. It can be challenging to make in three, so if you're feeling cautious you could bail out to the left and then chip and putt for par.

HOLE
11



PAR: 4



RANGE: 262m, 240m, 240m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Looks are a little deceiving at Hole 11. The greenside bunker, undulating green and sharp dog leg provide some good challenges. If you're feeling confident you could take it on with a driver, otherwise best to lay up short of the fairway bunker with a mid to long iron.

HOLE
12



PAR: 4



RANGE: 328m, 303m, 291m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

A fairway wood or iron off the tee will help with accuracy at this straight yet complex hole. A hazard catches loose drives on the right yet a good tee shot will leave you with a second shot to the large, flat and mostly open green.

HOLE
13



PAR: 4



RANGE: 399m, 374m, 359m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

On the right hand side of Hole 13, all the way from tee to green is an out of bounds area. A tee shot to the left can avoid this and will set up a mid to long iron to the tightly guarded green. Your next shot will be difficult; surrounded by water on the left and bunkers to the right.

HOLE
14



PAR: 5



RANGE: 502m, 485m, 461m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

This dogleg par 5, has a lake on the left so you'll have to play to the right. For the best chance of reaching the green in two, you could attempt to cut corners. Water guards the back of the green so wise to lay up. Also, take into consideration that the green slopes from front to back.

15



PAR: 4



RANGE: 330m, 306m, 285m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

This is the last hole in the open vineyards and has water and sand protecting the left side. The open fairway on the right means an excellent tee shot is achievable. If you're accurate you will be in a good position for a put on the undulating green.

HOLE
16



PAR: 5



RANGE: 436m, 425m, 376m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

If you can do a good tee shot you will have a choice in your approach for the second shot. Strong hitters could go straight for the green, clearing the bunkers on the right by staying to the left. The green is small but will put your putting skills to the test.

HOLE
17



PAR: 3



RANGE: 159m, 130m, 123m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

To ensure a par score, an accurate tee shot is a must. On the left of this hole is a bunker and on the right are grassy hollows, yet long shots are met with a water hazard so choose your club wisely. Putting once you make it to the green shouldn't be too much of a challenge.

18



PAR: 5



RANGE: 454m, 408m, 362m



HOLE DESCRIPTION:

Your final challenge will see reward for risk. A tee shot to the left will avoid the water and get you to the lay up area. Take caution as mistakes can be costly. The third shot is a wedge to the lower tier of the double green at the clubhouse.
